

In this our June 2025 bulletin we cover the latest developments and news about public sector procurement and contract management in the UK. PA2023.org training

On Monday 9 June 2025 we held our second PA2023.org training session. We looked at the tricky area of excluding suppliers under the Procurement Act 2023. Exclusion is much more than the Debarment regime. Understanding the many circumstances (we looked at 10 specific sections in the Act over-and-above Debarment) when the Act requires you to consider exclusion, is challenging enough but the greatest difficulty comes in those areas that require Contracting Authorities to exercise discretion and judgement ... this is the hardest part.

A summary of the technical & news matters we discussed during the training on Monday 9 June are:

1. [Siderise Insulation Ltd v Royal Borough of Kensington & Chelsea](#)

Siderise Insulation Ltd has launched judicial review proceedings against the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea following a decision on 11 December 2024 that excludes its products from construction projects in the borough. The exclusion is based on criteria linked to the Grenfell Tower fire. Our assessment is that Kensington and Chelsea will find it very difficult to justify their decision to exclude Siderise. Will be an interesting case to watch..

2. [Using dynamic markets below threshold - Find a Tender](#)

A welcome confirmation that Schools and most FE Colleges are permitted to use Dynamic Markets for below threshold procurement. The Welsh and Northern Ireland exceptions including.

3. [**VAT Reverse Charge for Building and Construction Services Manual - HMRC internal manual - GOV.UK**](#)

For those involved with works contracts this guide is useful. A complex area, the domestic reverse charge for building and construction services is a measure designed to counter criminal attacks on the UK VAT system. It applies to supplies that are reported within the Construction Industry Scheme.

4. [**NATO corruption probe 'reminder' of defense boom risks – DW – 05/19/2025**](#)

Revelations of an unfolding corruption investigation involving staff and ex-staff at the NATO Support and Procurement Agency have continued to emerge, with a total of five detentions — two in Belgium and three in the Netherlands — made public so far.

5. [**New HS2 fraud allegations as cost could pass £100bn and further delays expected**](#)

A labour supplier has been suspended from the West Midlands section of the rail project and a senior manager has resigned. The allegations are that an HS2 sub-contractor has been falsely declaring self-employed workers as PAYE (Pay as You Earn) salaried staff and charging an inflated rate for them, then submitting “fake” payslips, it is claimed. This is linked to the Construction Industry Scheme and will be of interest if you deal with works contracts.

The Panel's advice is that STW ICB should proceed with awarding the contract for the Targeted Lung Healthcare Checks for Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin as originally intended.

14. [Independent patient choice and procurement panel review of a proposed contract award CR0018-25](#)

Primary Care Partner (GP Services) for Urgent Treatment Centre at University Hospital Lewisham. The Panel's advice is that LGT return to an earlier step in the provider selection process.
